




Words of Assurance and Pardon of the Gospel



SERMON NOTES

Revelation 2.1-7 "Remember the Love You Had at First"

Discussion Questions

The following questions help us engage with the sermon, music, and liturgy in this morning's worship service, and may be useful during personal devotions, group studies, and family worship.

1.	Read Revelation 2.1-3.22. In what way are the letters to the seven churches applicable to the Church universal?
2.	If Jesus were to write a letter to the church in Dallas today, what do you think He would say?
3.	What did the church in Ephesus do well? How does this encourage us in our current cultural moment?
4.	Why did Jesus rebuke the church in Ephesus? What makes us susceptible to the same error?
5.	How did Jesus call the Ephesian church to repent? What might this look like in your own life?
6.	In the book of Ephesians, the Apostle Paul instructed the Ephesian church to "speak the truth in love." (See Ephesians 4.15) Why is dangerous to separate truth and love?
7.	How did Jesus reveal Himself to the Ephesian church? (See Revelation 2.1) How does the truth of Jesus lead us to love?
