


- And when the time came for their purification according to the Law of Moses, they brought Him up to Jerusalem to present Him to the Lord

Discussion Questions

The following questions help us engage with the sermon, music, and liturgy in this morning's worship service, and may be useful during personal devotions, group studies, and family worship.

- 1. Where do we tend to look for comfort?
- 2. Why is it significant that the Lord Himself says, "Comfort, comfort My people" (Isaiah 40.1)?
- 3. Why do we need the Lord's comfort (Isaiah 40.2)?
- 4. For what has Simeon been waiting (Luke 2.25-26)? For what are we waiting?
- 5. What does Simeon understand about Jesus' identity and destiny (Luke 2.29-35)?
- 6. Read Psalm 27.4, Luke 10.41-42, and Philippians 3.7-14. How do these "one thing" statements remind us of Simeon?
- 7. With the Lord's help, how can we pursue the comfort that He alone can provide?
