





SERMON NOTES

Revelation 10.1-11 "Big Feet and a Little Scroll"

Discussion Questions

The following questions help us engage with the sermon, music, and liturgy in this morning's worship service, and may be useful during personal devotions, group studies, and family worship.

1.	What is important to remember about the rhythm and structure of Revelation?
2	Who is the messenger?
3.	What is significant about how the messenger is described?
4.	What does the placement of the messenger's feet indicate? Why is this significant?
5.	What do the lion's roar and the seven thunders symbolize?
6.	In verse four, John reveals that he was about to write down what he heard from the sound of the seven thunders. But then he was told, "Do not write it down." What can we learn from this encounter?
7.	John is told to take and eat the little scroll. What does this mean?
8.	As he eats the little scroll, he is told it will be bittersweet. How are we to understand what this means?
9.	What are the takeaways for us as we encounter this rich interlude?
