

I rejoice in my Redeemer—Greatest Treasure, Wellspring of my soul. I will trust in Him, no other; my soul is satisfied in Him alone.


As summer flowers we fade and die; fame, youth and beauty hurry by. But life eternal calls to us at the cross.





Revelation 11.14-19 "The Last Trumpet"

Discussion Questions

The following questions help us engage with the sermon, music, and liturgy in this morning's worship service, and may be useful during personal devotions, group studies, and family worship.

1.	What promises does God make in the Bible? What do these promises reveal about the character of God?
2.	How are the promises of God different than the promises that we make to one another?
3.	Read 1 Thessalonians 4.13-18 and 1 Corinthians 15.51-57. What does the Apostle Paul say will happen when the last trumpet blows? Why are these words an encouragement to us?
4.	What is the Kingdom of Jesus Christ? How is the Kingdom of Jesus Christ already here? How is the Kingdom of Jesus Christ not yet fulfilled?
5.	What victory do we have through the death, resurrection, and return of Jesus Christ?
6.	What is the difference between a covenant and a contract? How do God's covenant promises give us hope in midst of trials, grief, and uncertainty?
7.	What does it mean to trust in the promises of God? What makes this trust difficult? What does this trust have to do with genuine faith?
