





Discussion Questions

The following questions help us engage with the sermon, music, and liturgy in this morning's worship service, and may be useful during personal devotions, group studies, and family worship.

- 1. What does the word "Hallelujah" mean? Where does this word appear in the Bible? What does this word tell us about the book of Revelation?
- 2. How was a wedding in ancient Judaism different than modern weddings today? What does an ancient Jewish wedding have to do with the story of the Bible?
- 3. What are some ways that the Bible describes Jesus as a bridegroom? What does this reveal about the way He relates to us?
- 4. What are some ways that the Bible describes the people of God as His Bride? What does this reveal about the way we relate to Him?
- 5. How does earthly marriage serve as an image for a much greater Marriage?
- 6. Read Revelation 19.7-8. How are we being made ready as the Bride of the Lamb?
- 7. Why is it significant that the marriage of the Lamb will be a feast? What does it mean to be invited to the marriage supper of the Lamb?
