

¹⁰ *And he carried me away in the Spirit to a great, high mountain, and showed me the holy city Jerusalem coming down out of heaven from God,*

¹¹ *having the glory of God, its radiance like a most rare jewel, like a jasper, clear as crystal.*

¹² *It had a great, high wall, with twelve gates, and at the gates twelve angels, and on the gates the names of the twelve tribes of the sons of Israel were inscribed—*



“The New City”

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

The following questions help us engage with the sermon, music, and liturgy in this morning's worship service, and may be useful during personal devotions, group studies, and family worship.

1. What role does the city of Jerusalem play in the Bible? What has God promised in the New Jerusalem?

3. What are the dimensions of New Jerusalem? What do these dimensions tell us about the New City to come?
4. What do the 12 gates of the New City represent? What do the 12 foundations of the New City represent? What does this tell us about the foundation of the Church today?
5. Read Hebrews 11.8-10. Who is the builder of the New City? Why does this matter?
6. Read Revelation 21.10. Why is it significant that the New City will come down out of heaven from God?
7. Read Hebrews 13.14. What does it look like to seek the New City that is to come?
