

Revelation 22.6-21

“He Is Coming Soon”

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

The following questions help us engage with the sermon, music, and liturgy in this morning's worship service, and may be useful during personal devotions, group studies, and family worship.

1. What are the last recorded words of Jesus in the Bible? Why are these words significant?
2. What is genuine faith? What is the difference between believing in God and trusting Him?
3. What are ways that we take away from Scripture? What are ways that we add to Scripture? Why are both equally dangerous?
4. Who may enter the gates of the city at the last judgment?
5. What does God's judgment have to do with His grace? How can there be no cross without the judgment of God?
6. Read Revelation 22.17. What does it mean to come to Jesus? Have you truly responded to this invitation?
7. Read Revelation 22.20. The prayer, "Come, Lord Jesus," became the cry of the early Church. What would it look like for us to faithfully live out this prayer today?
