Sermon Notes

Psalm 119.81-88

"The Rescue We Long For"

Discussion Questions

The following questions help us engage with the sermon, music, and liturgy in this morning's worship service, and may be useful during personal devotions, group studies, and family worship.

- 1. What are the two different uses of the word "kaph," the eleventh letter of the Hebrew alphabet?
- The Psalmist asks a "When?" type questions three times in the eight verses (82, 84). Around what part of your life are you asking "When?" to God?
- 3. How is the Psalmist engaging our eyes and noses with the poetic image of a wineskin?
- 4. The Psalmist is calling out to God because of persecution he is facing. How would you define those who persecute you? How does the Bible define persecution of the believer?
- 5. Who are our "foes" today? What do we share in common with our spiritual foes? What makes us different from our spiritual foes?
- 6. Read Philippians 2.1-10. How does Christ's humiliation and exultation relate to the Psalmist's journey of confronting his enemies?
- 7. How would the aroma of Christ be more diffused in our world as we choose to approach our foes the way Jesus did?
