Discussion Questions

The following questions help us engage with the sermon, music, and liturgy in this morning's worship service, and may be useful during personal devotions, group studies, and family worship.

- 1. What is the incarnation of Jesus Christ? Why can there be no Gospel without the incarnation?
- 2. The opening words of John 1.14 can be literally translated, "the Word became flesh and tabernacled among us." What was the tabernacle in the Old Testament? What does the tabernacle have to do with Jesus?
- 3. Read Exodus 33.18 and John 1.14. In what way is Jesus the fulfillment of Moses' prayer, "show me Your glory"?
- 4. Why does the incarnation make Jesus completely unique in all of history?
- 5. What is grace? How does the Bible tell one story of God's grace for His people?
- 6. How has God given us grace in place of grace through Jesus Christ?
