





So they said to him, "Who are you? We need to give an answer to those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?"

- ²³ He said, "I am the voice of one crying out in the wilderness, 'Make straight the way of the Lord,' as the prophet Isaiah said."
- ²⁴ (Now they had been sent from the Pharisees.)
- ²⁵ They asked him, "Then why are you baptizing, if you are neither the Christ, nor Elijah, nor the Prophet?"
- ²⁶ John answered them, "I baptize with water, but among you stands one you do not know,
- ²⁷ even He who comes after me, the strap of whose sandal I am not worthy to untie."

- ²⁸ These things took place in Bethany across the Jordan, where John was baptizing.

- ³⁴ And I have seen and have borne witness that this is the Son of God."



Discussion Questions

The following questions help us engage with the sermon, music, and liturgy in this morning's worship service, and may be useful during personal devotions, group studies, and family worship.

1.	Who does John the Baptist declare himself to be, and what does this reveal about his identity and character?
2.	How does John the Baptist's testimony distinguish him from Jesus?
3.	What is John the Baptist communicating when he describes the difference between his baptizing with water and Jesus baptizing with the Holy Spirit?
4.	Why is John's statement, "Behold, the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world," so powerful? Take time to unpack the significance of this statement.
5.	What is meant in John 1.33 that the "Spirit remained on Him?"
6.	Why does John give us these details early in his gospel?
