



Merciful Father, continue to purge our darkened hearts with the light of Your Gospel.






Words of Assurance and Pardon of the Gospel



On the third day there was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there.

- ² Jesus also was invited to the wedding with His disciples.
- ³ When the wine ran out, the mother of Jesus said to Him, "They have no wine."
- ⁴ And Jesus said to her, "Woman, what does this have to do with Me? My hour has not yet come."
- ⁵ His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever He tells you."
- ⁶ Now there were six stone water jars there for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons.
- Jesus said to the servants, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim.
- ⁸ And He said to them, "Now draw some out and take it to the master of the feast." So they took it.
- When the master of the feast tasted the water now become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the master of the feast called the bridegroom
- o and said to him, "Everyone serves the good wine first, and when people have drunk freely, then the poor wine. But you have kept the good wine until now."
- ¹¹ This, the first of His signs, Jesus did at Cana in Galilee, and manifested His glory. And His disciples believed in Him.



SERMON NOTES

John 2.1-11

"The Wedding and the Wine"

Discussion Questions

The following questions help us engage with the sermon, music, and liturgy in this morning's worship service, and may be useful during personal devotions, group studies, and family worship.

1.	What is a miracle? Why did Jesus perform miracles during His earthly ministry?
2.	Why was it a problem that there was no more wine at a wedding? What did the absence of wine symbolize in the Old Testament? (See Isaiah 24.7-11)
3.	Read John 2.4. Why did Jesus say, "My hour has not yet come"? What does the word "hour" refer to in the Gospel of John?
4.	Read John 2.6. What were the stone water jars ordinarily used for? Why is this significant?
5.	What does sin have to do with being dirty? How has Jesus made us clean?
6.	Why did Jesus turn the water into wine? What does wine symbolize in the Bible? (See Zechariah 10.6-7 and Matthew 26.27-29)
7.	Why did Jesus perform His first miracle at a wedding? What does this miracle tell us about Jesus?


