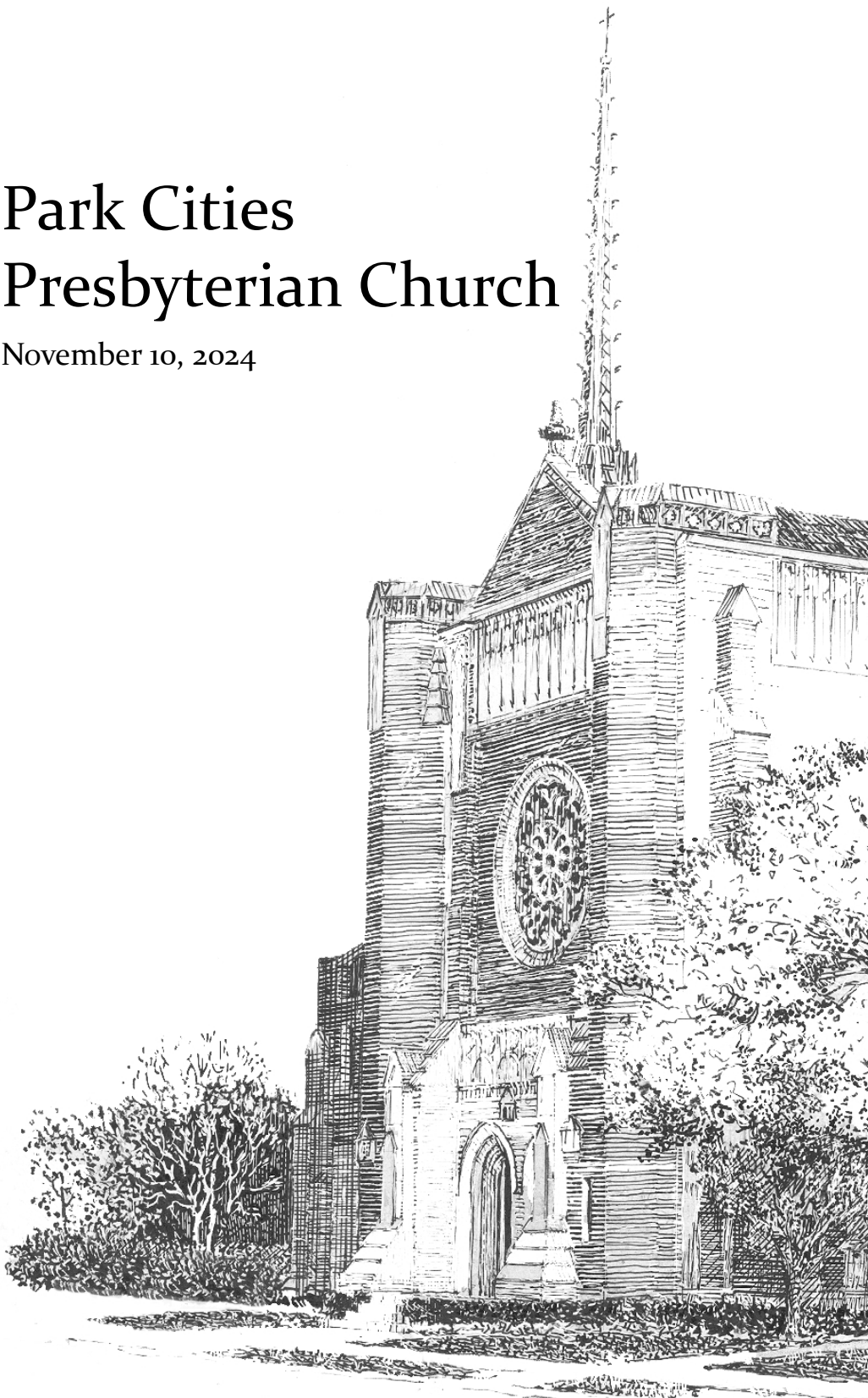



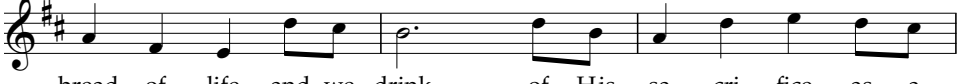

“Deep and Wide—the Powerful Witness of a Transformed Life”

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

The following questions help us engage with the sermon, music, and liturgy in this morning's worship service, and may be useful during personal devotions, group studies, and family worship.

1. Review the conversation between Jesus and the woman at the well. After the disciples return, what happens?
2. Why did the woman leave?
3. What did the woman leave behind? Is this significant? Why?
4. What was her message to the people of Samaria? What strikes you about this message?
5. What compelled the woman to return and speak to the the people of Samaria?
6. How did the people respond to her message?
7. How can her example in word and witness encourage us to share our faith?
8. How do you think and feel about your own story and inviting others to “come and see the Man who told me everything about myself”?
