#### \*The Scripture Reading: John 5.1-18

After this there was a feast of the Jews, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem.

- <sup>2</sup> Now there is in Jerusalem by the Sheep Gate a pool, in Aramaic called Bethesda, which has five roofed colonnades.
- <sup>3</sup> In these lay a multitude of invalids—blind, lame, and paralyzed.
- <sup>5</sup> One man was there who had been an invalid for thirty-eight years.
- <sup>6</sup> When Jesus saw him lying there and knew that he had already been there a long time, He said to him, "Do you want to be healed?"
- <sup>7</sup> The sick man answered Him, "Sir, I have no one to put me into the pool when the water is stirred up, and while I am going another steps down before me."
- <sup>8</sup> Jesus said to him, "Get up, take up your bed, and walk."
- <sup>9</sup> And at once the man was healed, and he took up his bed and walked. Now that day was the Sabbath.
- <sup>10</sup> So the Jews said to the man who had been healed, "It is the Sabbath, and it is not lawful for you to take up your bed."
- <sup>11</sup> But he answered them, "The Man who healed me, that Man said to me, 'Take up your bed, and walk."
- <sup>12</sup> They asked him, "Who is the Man who said to you, 'Take up your bed and walk'?"
- <sup>13</sup> Now the man who had been healed did not know who it was, for Jesus had withdrawn, as there was a crowd in the place.
- <sup>14</sup> Afterward Jesus found him in the temple and said to him, "See, you are well! Sin no more, that nothing worse may happen to you."
- <sup>15</sup> The man went away and told the Jews that it was Jesus who had healed him.
- <sup>16</sup> And this was why the Jews were persecuting Jesus, because He was doing these things on the Sabbath.
- <sup>17</sup> But Jesus answered them, "My Father is working until now, and I am working."
- <sup>18</sup> This was why the Jews were seeking all the more to kill Him, because not only was He breaking the Sabbath, but He was even calling God His own Father, making Himself equal with God.



John 5.1-18

"Walking on the Sabbath"

#### **Discussion Questions**

The following questions help us engage with the sermon, music, and liturgy in this morning's worship service, and may be useful during personal devotions, group studies, and family worship.

- 1. As you observe the healing of the invalid by the pool of Bethesda, what stands out as notable to you?
- 2. How do you see the sovereignty of God at work in Jesus' encounter with the paralyzed man?
- 3. What is significant about Jesus' question, "Do you want to be healed"?
- 4. What can we make of the way the man responded to Jesus' question?
- 5. Jesus says to the man, "Get up, take up your bed and walk." What is significant about the second part of that statement?
- 6. How do the Jews respond to the healing? How does the man respond to the Jews?
- 7. What is significant about Jesus seeking out the man again?
- 8. With this miracle taking place on the Sabbath, Jesus has more in mind than just healing the man's infirmity. What is significant about His dialogue with the Jews?
