





Discussion Questions

The following questions help us engage with the sermon, music, and liturgy in this morning's worship service, and may be useful during personal devotions, group studies, and family worship.

- 1. According to this passage, how would you summarize God leading His people?
- 2. What is significant about the path God chose to lead them on? Trace this story and look for what this narrative reveals about God's attributes.
- 3. How has God taken you on a path that wasn't easy to understand? How did that impact your faith?
- 4. What is a theophany?
- 5. How does God choose to lead His people by day and by night?
- 6. What is powerful about these realities for the people of God?
- 7. For those who are in Christ, what do we have that is even more powerful than the pillars of cloud and fire?
- 8. How is this reality making a difference in your daily walk?
- 9. How does the path that Jesus walked connect to Exodus 13.22?
- 10. As you trace your own story, how do you see the light of Christ leading you?
