
- ² saying, "Where is He who has been born King of the Jews? For we saw His star when it rose and have come to worship Him."
- ³ When Herod the king heard this, he was troubled, and all Jerusalem with him;
- ⁴ and assembling all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Christ was to be born.
- ⁵ They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for so it is written by the prophet:
- ⁶ 'And you, O Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a Ruler who will shepherd My people Israel.'"
- ⁷ Then Herod summoned the wise men secretly and ascertained from them what time the star had appeared.
- ⁸ And he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the Child, and when you have found Him, bring me word, that I too may come and worship Him."
- 9 After listening to the king, they went on their way. And behold, the star that they had seen when it rose went before them until it came to rest over the place where the Child was.
- ¹⁰ When they saw the star, they rejoiced exceedingly with great joy.

Matthew 2.1-12

"The Ultimate Light: Wisdom for the Nations"

Discussion Questions

The following questions help us engage with the sermon, music, and liturgy in this morning's worship service, and may be useful during personal devotions, group studies, and family worship.

- 1. Read Isaiah 9.1-4. What is the prophet Isaiah referring to when he speaks of "deep darkness"?
- 2. How does the context of 400 years of prophetic silence add significance to how we read this text today? Where are we tempted to fall into unbelief when we feel that God is being silent?
- 3. Why was King Herod and all of Jerusalem troubled that the wisemen wanted to worship the Messiah?
- 4. What do the wisemen represent in the original context of the Christmas story? Pondering the light of Jesus shining in the darkness, what wisdom is our darkness, and how does Jesus' light shine on it?
- 5. What is the wisdom of the world in which you are most tempted to replace the wisdom God has given us in Jesus?
- 6. The wise man "fell down and worshipped Him...they offered Him gifts..." How does this response warm our hearts to how we should respond to Jesus' presence in our lives?
