***The Scripture Reading: John 10.1-18**

- “Truly, truly, I say to you, he who does not enter the sheepfold by the door but climbs in by another way, that man is a thief and a robber.
2 But he who enters by the door is the shepherd of the sheep.
3 To him the gatekeeper opens. The sheep hear his voice, and he calls his own sheep by name and leads them out.
4 When he has brought out all his own, he goes before them, and the sheep follow him, for they know his voice.
5 A stranger they will not follow, but they will flee from him, for they do not know the voice of strangers.”
6 This figure of speech Jesus used with them, but they did not understand what He was saying to them.
7 So Jesus again said to them, “Truly, truly, I say to you, I am the door of the sheep.
8 All who came before Me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not listen to them.
9 I am the door. If anyone enters by Me, he will be saved and will go in and out and find pasture.
10 The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life and have it abundantly.
11 I am the good Shepherd. The good Shepherd lays down His life for the sheep.
12 He who is a hired hand and not a shepherd, who does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and flees, and the wolf snatches them and scatters them.
13 He flees because he is a hired hand and cares nothing for the sheep.
14 I am the good Shepherd. I know My own and My own know Me,
15 just as the Father knows Me and I know the Father; and I lay down My life for the sheep.
16 And I have other sheep that are not of this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to My voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd.
17 For this reason the Father loves Me because I lay down My life that I may take it up again.
18 No one takes it from Me, but I lay it down of My own accord. I have authority to lay it down, and I have authority to take it up again. This charge I have received from My Father.”*



John 10.1-18
“The Good Shepherd”

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

The following questions help us engage with the sermon, music, and liturgy in this morning's worship service, and may be useful during personal devotions, group studies, and family worship.

1. What are the seven I AM statements in the Gospel of John? What do these statements tell us about Jesus?
2. How does seeing Jesus as a Shepherd change the way that you relate to Him?
3. If Jesus is our Shepherd, how are we like sheep?
4. Read John 10.14. What does it mean to know Jesus? What does it mean to be known by Jesus?
5. In what way is Jesus the door of the sheep? (See John 10.7-9) How is Jesus both our protection and our provision?
6. Read John 10.16. How can we listen to the voice of Jesus?
7. How did Jesus lay down His life for us? How did Jesus take it up again? Why is it significant that He did all of this by His own authority? (See John 10.18)
