*The Scripture Reading: Matthew 28

Now after the Sabbath, toward the dawn of the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb.

- ² And behold, there was a great earthquake, for an angel of the Lord descended from heaven and came and rolled back the stone and sat on it.
- ³ His appearance was like lightning, and his clothing white as snow.
- ⁴ And for fear of him the guards trembled and became like dead men.
- ⁵ But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified.
- ⁶ He is not here, for He has risen, as He said. Come, see the place where He lay.
- ⁷ Then go quickly and tell His disciples that He has risen from the dead, and behold, He is going before you to Galilee; there you will see Him. See, I have told you."
- ⁸ So they departed quickly from the tomb with fear and great joy, and ran to tell His disciples.

- ⁹ And behold, Jesus met them and said, "Greetings!" And they came up and took hold of His feet and worshiped Him.
- Then Jesus said to them, "Do not be afraid; go and tell My brothers to go to Galilee, and there they will see Me."
- ¹¹ While they were going, behold, some of the guard went into the city and told the chief priests all that had taken place.
- ¹² And when they had assembled with the elders and taken counsel, they gave a sufficient sum of money to the soldiers
- ¹³ and said, "Tell people, 'His disciples came by night and stole Him away while we were asleep.'
- ¹⁴ And if this comes to the governor's ears, we will satisfy him and keep you out of trouble."
- ¹⁵ So they took the money and did as they were directed. And this story has been spread among the Jews to this day.
- ¹⁶ Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them.
- ¹⁷ And when they saw Him they worshiped Him, but some doubted.
- ¹⁸ And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to Me.
- ¹⁹ Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit,
- ²⁰ teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

SERMON NOTES

Matthew 28 "Just As He Said"

Discussion Questions

The following questions help us dialog with the sermon, music, and liturgy in this morning's worship service. Together, these elements provide space for reflection and prayer during personal devotions, group studies, and family worship.

1.	How might you summarize the various responses in Matthew 28 to the news of Jesus' resurrection? Pastor Davis used three words: D
2.	What is significant about the angel's message when he says, "As He said," in verse 28.6? What comfort and encouragement does this bring us regarding the Word of God?
3.	How did both Marys respond when they saw the risen Lord Jesus? What is revealing about them grabbing His feet?
4.	Describe the guards and their response to the resurrection.
5.	Detail the evil that is present in the message the chief priests and elders direct the guards to say. How are people being deceived today?
6.	When the disciples finally see Jesus we are told, "And when they saw Him they worshiped Him, but some doubted." Why do you think they doubted? Do you have doubts? What do you do with your doubts?
7.	What is the message Jesus leaves with His disciples? What does it mean to "make disciples"? Why is this significant for us?

Isaiah saw this, and he cried:

Death was angered when it encountered You in the lower regions.

It was angered, for it was defeated.

It was angered, for it was mocked.

It was angered, for it was abolished.

It was angered, for it was overthrown.

It was angered, for it was bound in chains.

It received a body and it met God face to face.

It took earth and encountered heaven.

It took that which is seen and fell upon the unseen.

O Death, where is your sting?

O Grave, where is your victory?

Christ is risen and you are overthrown.

Christ is risen and the devils have fallen.

Christ is risen and the angels rejoice.

Christ is risen and life reigns.

Christ is risen and not one dead remains in the grave.
