





The next day the large crowd that had come to the feast heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem.

- ¹³ So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet Him, crying out, "Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord, even the King of Israel!"
- ¹⁴ And Jesus found a young donkey and sat on it, just as it is written,
- ¹⁵ "Fear not, daughter of Zion; behold, your King is coming, sitting on a donkey's colt!"
- ¹⁶ His disciples did not understand these things at first, but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that these things had been written about Him and had been done to Him.

SERMON NOTES

John 12.12-23 "The World Has Gone After Him"

Discussion Questions

The following questions help us engage with the sermon, music, and liturgy in this morning's worship service, and may be useful during personal devotions, group studies, and family worship.

1.	What happened at the triumphal entry of Jesus? What makes John's account of the triumphal entry unique among the Gospels?
2.	What did the disciples not understand about Jesus? Why did they not understand Him?
3.	Why was Jesus a threat to the Pharisees? What does Jesus threaten in your own life? Why is this threat for your ultimate good?
4.	Read John 12.25-26. What do Jesus' words teach us about the cost of following Him?
5.	What assumptions did the crowd make about the voice that they heard? What assumptions did they make about Jesus? What assumptions do people make about Jesus today?
6.	Read John 12.27. For what purpose did Jesus come?
7.	Why were the Pharisees exactly right when they said, "the world has gone after Him?" How has the death of Jesus fulfilled this proclamation? (See John 12.32-33)
