*The Scripture Reading: Haggai 2.10-23

On the twenty-fourth day of the ninth month, in the second year of Darius, the word of the LORD came by Haggai the prophet,

- " "Thus says the LORD of hosts: Ask the priests about the law:
- '2' 'If someone carries holy meat in the fold of his garment and touches with his fold bread or stew or wine or oil or any kind of food, does it become holy?"

 The priests answered and said, "No."
- ¹³ Then Haggai said, "If someone who is unclean by contact with a dead body touches any of these, does it become unclean?" The priests answered and said, "It does become unclean."
- ¹⁴ Then Haggai answered and said, "So is it with this people, and with this nation before me, declares the LORD, and so with every work of their hands. And what they offer there is unclean.
- Now then, consider from this day onward. Before stone was placed upon stone in the temple of the LORD,
- how did you fare? When one came to a heap of twenty measures, there were but ten. When one came to the wine vat to draw fifty measures, there were but twenty.
- ¹⁷ I struck you and all the products of your toil with blight and with mildew and with hail, yet you did not turn to me, declares the LORD.
- ¹⁸ Consider from this day onward, from the twenty-fourth day of the ninth month. Since the day that the foundation of the LORD's temple was laid, consider:

- ¹⁹ Is the seed yet in the barn? Indeed, the vine, the fig tree, the pomegranate, and the olive tree have yielded nothing. But from this day on I will bless you."
- The word of the LORD came a second time to Haggai on the twenty-fourth day of the month,
- ²¹ "Speak to Zerubbabel, governor of Judah, saying, I am about to shake the heavens and the earth,
- ²² and to overthrow the throne of kingdoms. I am about to destroy the strength of the kingdoms of the nations, and overthrow the chariots and their riders. And the horses and their riders shall go down, every one by the sword of his brother.
- ²³ On that day, declares the LORD of hosts, I will take you, O Zerubbabel my servant, the son of Shealtiel, declares the LORD, and make you like a signet ring, for I have chosen you, declares the LORD of hosts."

Discussion Questions

Part 1: "You're Totally Incapable" (vv. 10-14)

- 1. Why do you think God wanted His people to realize that their efforts to build the temple were "unclean"?
- 2. In what ways do you see "self-reliance" showing up in your Christian life—whether in pride ("I've got this") or in despair ("I'll never get this right")?
- 3. How does starting each day with the mindset "I can do nothing apart from Christ" (John 15:5) practically shape your prayer life, priorities, or expectations?

Part 2: "I Am Gracious" (vv. 15–19)

- 4. Haggai's audience hadn't returned to God, yet He still said, "From this day on I will bless you." What does that teach us about God's character—and how does that confront our instinct to "earn" His favor?
- 5. John Newton once wrote, "You are not called to buy but to beg." What might it look like to live as a "beggar of grace" rather than a "spender of effort"?
- 6. Think about an area in your life where you feel stuck or frustrated. Could God be using that to drive you to deeper dependence on Him? What would it mean to "despair of self" there and cling to His grace?

Part 3: "I Will Win" (vv. 20-23)

- 7. God's final word through Haggai was to Zerubbabel—a promise of victory and a coming King. How does that help you face a world that often seems opposed to God's purposes?
- 8. The sermon said the gospel is political because it declares that Jesus is King. How should that truth affect how we relate to earthly powers, politics, and cultural pressures today?
- 9. Zerubbabel's line ultimately led to Jesus, the true temple and King. How does seeing Jesus as both temple (God with us) and King (God reigning over us) deepen your worship or confidence in Him?

Managed by the Global Missions Committee, this fund receives requests from our church's international partners and prayerfully seeks the Lord's direction for how these resources can be most strategically used to support the birth of new congregations around the world.

Global Missions Giving Highlights

Merchant City Church - Glasgow, Scotland

Pastors David Trimble and Neil Longwe lead this new church in the heart of Glasgow, seeking to fulfill the city's prayerful motto: "Let Glasgow flourish by the preaching of Your Word and the praising of Your name." Their mission is to connect creative, curious, and everyday people to Christ.

Teranga Village - Senegal

In partnership with the Evangelical Presbyterian Church of Senegal, Teranga Village will provide safe housing for dozens of girls from an unreached community, protecting them from trafficking and helping them flourish as children of God.

City to City - Latin America and Colombia

Led by longtime PCPC missionaries Ruth & Andres Garza and Pastor José Escobar, this ministry trains pastors for gospel-centered church planting. PCPC has participated in their training conferences and outreach in Cartagena, Colombia.

All future gifts will be reviewed by the Global Missions Committee, with consideration given to their strategic alignment and impact.
