Ephesians 2:4-10

“The Grace and Glory of God’s Workmanship”

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

The following questions help us engage with the sermon, music, and liturgy in this morning's worship service, and may be useful during personal devotions, group studies, and family worship.

1. What does it mean to be seated with Him in the heavenly places?
How does this reality inform our daily living?
2. Why do you think Paul describes God's grace the way he does in Ephesians 2:7?
3. What is Paul emphasizing in Ephesians 2:5 and 2:8-9?
4. What is justification? What is sanctification? How would you explain their relationship?
5. From this passage, how would you explain to someone the place of works in salvation?
6. Read John 15:8. How does this support what Paul is teaching in Ephesians 2:10?
7. Who is the source of our good works? Why does this matter?
8. Where in your life do you see evidence of God's workmanship? Praise Him for His faithfulness. Where in your life is the Holy Spirit teaching, rebuking, correcting, and training you in righteousness? Praise Him!
