

## **SERMON NOTES**

Ephesians 2.17-22  
“What God Is Building”

## DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

*The following questions help us engage with the sermon, music, and liturgy in this morning's worship service, and may be useful during personal devotions, group studies, and family worship.*

1. How would we compare the kingdoms of this world to the Kingdom God is building?
2. We are “fellow citizens” in the Kingdom that God rules! (v. 19) How does this impact our lives?
3. How would we compare the families of this world to the family God is building?
4. We are “members of the household of God”, the family that He loves! (v. 19) How has this changed our lives?
5. Why are the apostles and prophets the foundation of what God is building? (v. 20) Upon what other foundations are we tempted to build?
6. Why is Christ Jesus Himself the Cornerstone? (v. 20) What does it mean that Jesus is the Cornerstone for our church and our individual lives?
7. Trace the history of God dwelling with His people from Genesis to Revelation.
8. We are stones in the temple in which God dwells! (vv. 21-22, see also 1 Pet. 2:4-5) How should this impact our lives?
9. How can we know that we are part of what God is building? How can we have access? (vv. 17-18)
