Over the years, McCawley and her Boies Schiller colleagues have represented survivors who have obtained many millions in Epstein-related settlements—including \$365 million in a class action filed against two major banks that had Epstein as a client. And even though Epstein died five years ago and Maxwell is serving a 20-year prison sentence, the litigation spawned by their misdeeds continues—with [REDACTED] as only the latest example.
