THE BLESSINGS OF INTERGENERATIONAL MINISTRY

Upcoming Intergenerational Conference

This April, PCPC will host the Made for More Conference, bringing together women and girls from 3rd to 12th grade. PCPC is excited to welcome the PCA Women's Ministry for this event, which aims to connect women of all ages across PCA churches in the region. Previous conferences have been successfully held in cities like Annapolis, San Diego, and Birmingham.



These gatherings are designed to spark meaningful conversations about faith and identity, focusing on creation design, gospel identity, and intergenerational friendships. Dallas will join this journey as PCPC hosts our regional PCA women, highlighting the blessings of intergenerational ministry.

"Intergenerational ministry deepens and transforms relationships within the Church."

The Church needs intergenerational ministry. As our faith grows and transforms, we benefit from the wisdom and guidance of brothers and sisters of all ages. This type of ministry is modeled in Scripture and is vital in our lives. We gain wisdom from those further along in their faith journey, while children often surprise us with their remarkable expressions of faith and understanding of God. Intergenerational ministry deepens and transforms relationships within the Church.

Intergenerational Ministry in Scripture

Scripture provides several examples of intergenerational ministry. God calls His people to pass faith from generation to generation, and Jesus emphasizes the importance of childlike faith.

God desires that knowledge of Him be shared across generations. When Moses presented God's Law to Israel, he instructed them to *"teach them diligently to your children"* (Deuteronomy 6:7). David echoes this in his psalm, stating, *"One generation shall commend Your works to another, and shall declare Your mighty acts"* (Psalm 145:4). Through Moses and David, God instructs His people to guide the next generation in understanding His commands and knowing the stories of His wonders. This intergenerational sharing continues in the early church. The Apostle Paul reminds Timothy of his sincere faith, which first lived in his grandmother Lois and his mother Eunice (2 Timothy 1:5). Paul assumes Timothy has inherited this sincere faith from his family. In Scripture, faith and knowledge of God are passed down from elders to younger generations.

Jesus also highlights children as examples of faith. When His disciples asked who would be the greatest in the Kingdom of God, Jesus called a child to Him and said, *"Whoever humbles himself like this child is the greatest in the Kingdom of heaven"* (Matthew 18:4). Jesus ensures His disciples recognize the faith displayed by children as examples of humility. Paul also encourages Timothy,



"Let no one despise you for your youth, but set the believers an example in speech, in conduct, in love, in faith, in purity" (1 Timothy 4:12). These passages show that younger generations can exemplify faith to their elders. Scripture reminds us that intergenerational ministry strengthens our faith and knowledge of God.



Intergenerational Ministry in the Church Today

This continues in the church today. As we prepare to host Made for More, we reflect on how God uses intergenerational relationships to draw people closer to Him at PCPC. Bible studies, mission trips, and Sunday Morning Communities are just a few examples of settings where multigenerational relationships flourish in the church. These settings help us embrace what Scripture teaches about intergenerational ministry.

Leslie Newman, Senior Coordinator and Discippler to Women's Ministry, noted, *"We need each other to grow and become more like Christ. The younger generation often has energy and vision. They ask questions that challenge and engage older generations. The older generations have experience. They have witnessed the wonders and faithfulness of God and can encourage and strengthen the faith of those younger than them."* Leslie loves seeing the generational interplay in Bible studies and at Women's Ministry Retreats.

Barrett Ball, Coordinator for Children's Ministry and VBS, expressed excitement for the upcoming conference: *"We are really excited for our young girls to come alongside our middle school and high school girls at this conference. It really is a fantastic energy when all women are involved."*



This energy is a gift from the Holy Spirit as God moves us to fellowship. We receive and give the blessings of sharing God's Word and works across generations.
