


WHERE ARE THE PARISHES?





GROWING AS A CHURCH FAMILY

WHAT IS GOD DOING IN PARISHES?

When you think about Park Cities Presbyterian Church, what comes to mind? Is it our building? Is it a Pastor or a teacher? Is it a Bible study, Sunday Morning Community, or small group? Is it a priority like missions? When the Apostle Paul thinks about the Church, he often turns to metaphors like the body of Christ and the bride of Christ. But perhaps the most accessible picture of the Church is "the household of God" (Galatians 6:10; 1 Timothy 3:14-15). By His grace we are "no longer aliens and strangers," but "fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God" (Ephesians 2:19).



In this remarkable family, we have a perfect heavenly Father and a perfect older Brother in our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Being the family of God highlights our primary identity as beloved children of God and the privilege



of having fathers and mothers, brothers and sisters, and sons and daughters in the faith. Being the family of God reminds us that, like any family, every member matters, conflict happens, and we're called to love, forgive, and grow together. Being the family of God reframes corporate worship as a weekly family reunion. We gather to praise the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, to remember who we are, and to be nourished to live as the children of God throughout the week.

In any church family, Sunday morning is the highlight of our week. The Lord is with us in a powerful way as we gather together under His Word and Sacrament, but we also want to live in His presence when we're scattered the rest of the week. Parish ministry gives us the opportunity to connect to Christ and one another, to abide in Christ, and to extend Christ where He has called us to live most of our lives. With our church family scattered across 14 neighborhood parishes and 5 large regions, we have a great opportunity to love one another in such a way that we are salt and light all around the Dallas-Fort Worth Metroplex.

In recent months, we've seen the Lord build up our church family around the city through parish dinners and prayer meetings. In October and February, we helped organize parish dinners in homes around the city. PCPC Members volunteered to host in their parish, and then members of that parish registered for and enjoyed dinner together. The feedback we've received has been so encouraging. Old friendships were rekindled, new friendships were formed, and brothers and sisters in Christ enjoyed good

food and sweet fellowship. In some cases, these dinners brought together three or four generations of believers to enjoy a meal, share their stories, and pray for one another. One member said, "It was a great introductory evening to what we believe will be a long-time friendship." In the past year, we've had around 70 parish dinners. Hundreds of people have gathered around a table and grown closer as brothers and sisters in Christ. Healthy families eat together, and we want to prioritize this simple, powerful practice in a world that's starving for real relationships.



At the end of March, we organized parish prayer meetings for the first time. We found hosts in fifteen parishes around the city, and we asked an Elder, Deacon, or Pastor to lead people through a prayer guide we created. As we received reports from the different gatherings, we rejoiced in the Lord. One woman said, "It was encouraging to see many people craving something like this...and asking to have it as a regular rhythm." One of the prayer leaders reported, "We met for over two hours, and the people didn't want to stop or leave!"



As the stories streamed in, we learned that over 200 of our members attended a prayer meeting that day. I loved imagining our church family, gathered in homes around the city, lifting their voices in concert to our heavenly Father. We prayed for one another, for our neighbors, for our church, and for the world. Healthy families pray together, and the Lord is teaching us to pray (Luke 11:1)!

Being the family of God reminds us that our fellowship starts now but stretches into eternity. If we are brothers and sisters in Christ, we'll spend eternity worshiping the Lord and loving one another. But we don't have to wait to experience the joy of living "in the household of God". Through parish ministry, we hope that more of our church family will enjoy a foretaste of the perfect fellowship that is to come!
