WOMEN: ENCOUNTERING THE LORD TOGETHER

Gathering as a church body for WinterGrace was a beautiful reminder of how good and edifying it is to enter into Word-centered corporate worship with the family of God and how the Lord is glorified when we do so! This spring, PCPC women of all ages have an opportunity to gather for a unique, in-town retreat called "ENCOUNTER" inside our beautiful church building to soak in God's Word and worship Him in song. But what does this opportunity mean, and why should we not let it pass us by?

Throughout the Old and New Testaments, believers are instructed to bring our sacrifices of praise continually before the Lord and not to forsake the assembly of the saints (Hebrews 10:25). Clearly, the Body of Christ needs to continually feed on God's Word and worship together.

By God's design, there is mutual encouragement and nourishment we draw from Spirit-based fellowship together. Sheep live in herds for a reason! It is out of this fullness of fellowship that we can then extend God's grace and love toward others both within and outside our church doors.

On the weekend of April 17-18, the women of PCPC will have an opportunity to enjoy the privilege of gathering together as we lift our voices in prayer and praise to the Lord. We are calling this weekend "ENCOUNTER."

Thankfully, we know we don't only encounter God on these special weekends, but our hope is that this intentional time will encourage us in our ongoing walk as we seek to encounter the Lord daily in His Word.

For those of us in Christ, we first encounter the living God when we are converted – a personal, life-changing experience that leads to our new identity as a child of God. His Word, which is living and active and sharper than any two-edged sword, confronts us with the piercing truth that we are sinners who can never save ourselves. Further, as we open our Bibles to meditate, pray, and sing God's Word throughout the day, we continue to encounter a God whose powerful Word brought the universe into being and whose voice calmed the raging seas.

As R.C. Sproul so poignantly expressed, we marvel at "the power that is unleashed when God speaks...bringing things out of nothing and life out of death."



During ENCOUNTER weekend, the women of our church look forward to encountering the Word of God together as we center our hearts on the Psalms. We will be joined by singer-songwriter Caroline Cobb to guide us through this time. We will be encouraged by her as she points us back to the Psalms and reminds us that the Psalter serves as "a prompt and pattern as you seek His face, a compass as you process your joys and sorrows, and an anchor to steady you against the storms brewing dark on the horizon."



It will be a great joy to read and sing the Psalms together as blood-bought believers of the New Covenant and remember that these same words were corporately sung by Old Covenant believers as they anticipated the coming Messiah. Most astoundingly of all, when we remember that the Psalms were spoken and sung by Jesus Himself, we are reminded of the importance of feeding on them every chance we get! As our church body studies Ephesians together, we also see the Apostle Paul emphasizing the role of Psalms in the life of the church, encouraging us to speak to one another in "psalms and hymns and spiritual songs (Ephesians 5:19)."



What a gift it will be for the women of our church to gather together, letting the word of Christ dwell in us richly as we sing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in our hearts to God (Colossians 3:16). See the schedule below, and make plans to join us!

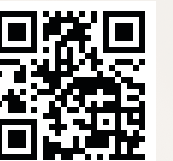
