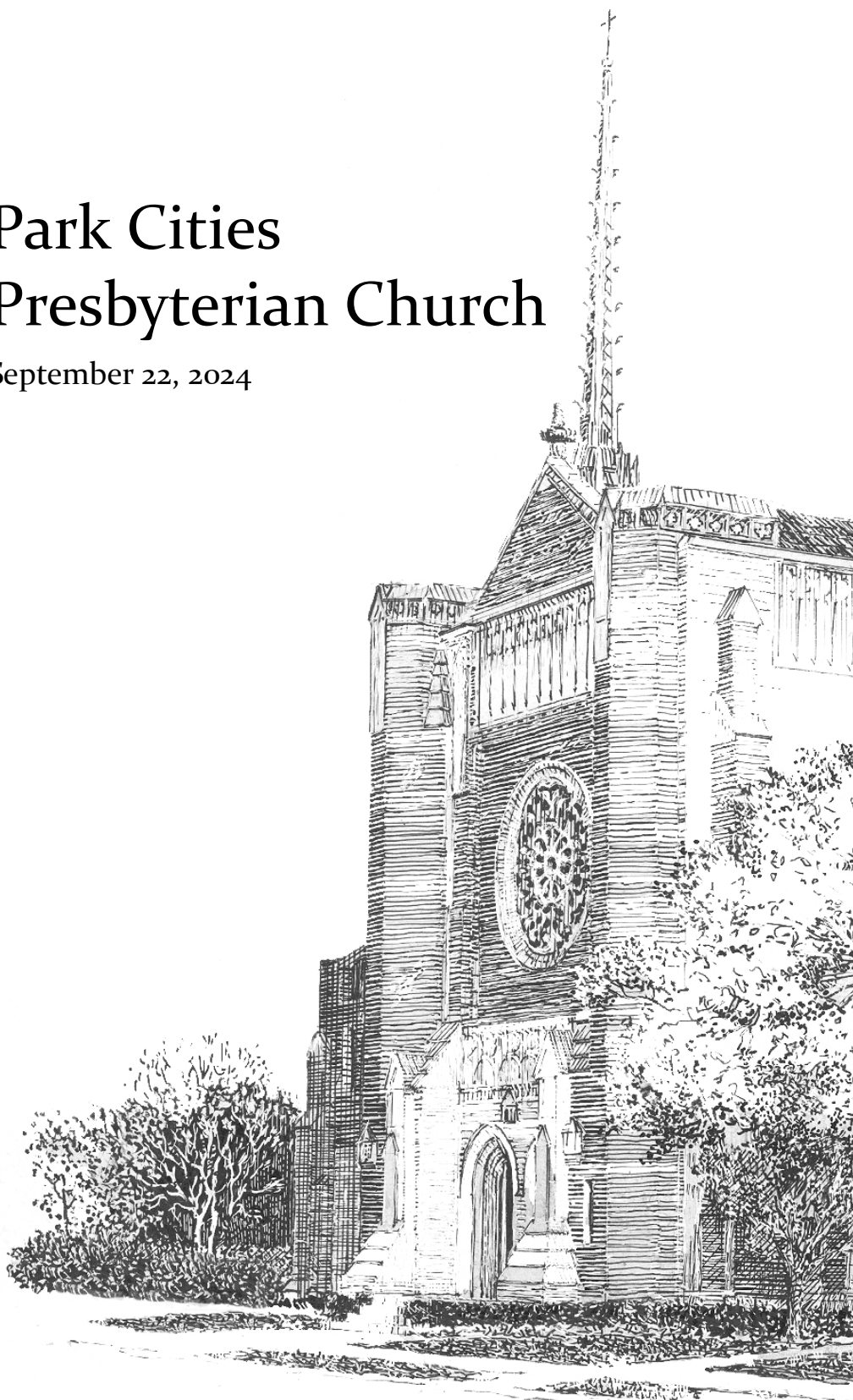

- <sup>46</sup> Nathanael said to him, “Can anything good come out of Nazareth?” Philip said to him, “Come and see.”
- <sup>47</sup> Jesus saw Nathanael coming toward Him and said of him, “Behold, an Israelite indeed, in whom there is no deceit!”
- <sup>48</sup> Nathanael said to Him, “How do You know me?” Jesus answered him, “Before Philip called you, when you were under the fig tree, I saw you.”

## DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

*The following questions help us engage with the sermon, music, and liturgy in this morning's worship service, and may be useful during personal devotions, group studies, and family worship.*

1. What does it mean to be a disciple? Who or what are you a disciple of other than Jesus?
2. Why does John the Baptist refer to Jesus as the Lamb of God? Why is this title significant in the book of Revelation? (See Revelation 5.6-14)
3. Read John 1.38. What do you want most from Jesus?
4. John teaches us that the word "Messiah" means "Christ." What are we saying about Jesus when we refer to Him as Jesus Christ?
5. Read John 1.46. How did Philip respond to Nathaniel's skepticism about Jesus? What do these words have to do with the mission of the Church?
6. Read Genesis 28.10-17. What does this passage have to do with Jesus' promise in John 1.51? Why is this promise good news?
7. Are you a follower of Jesus? Why or why not?
