

## DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

*The following questions help us dialog with the sermon, music, and liturgy in this morning's worship service. Together, these elements provide space for reflection and prayer during personal devotions, group studies, and family worship.*

1. How can we discern the will of God?
2. When we pray, "Your will be done," what are we asking God to do?
3. How is praying "Your will be done" a great prayer of faith?
4. What challenges might face a believer when we pray "Your will be done?"
5. How does Jesus' example in the garden of Gethsemane encourage us to pray "Your will be done?"

### Prayer Prompts:

*Use the following prompts to guide you in prayer this week: Matthew 6.9-13  
"Your will be done"*

1. Ask God to focus and humble your heart before Him using the words of Psalm 143.8, "Let me hear in the morning of Your steadfast love, for in You I trust. Make me know the way I should go, for to You I lift up my soul."
2. Praise God for revealing Himself to us and revealing His will for us in the Bible.
3. Ask God to convict you of ways you are living according to your own will and to convince you of the blessing of obeying His will.
4. Pray for a specific need in your life using the words of Romans 12.2, "that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect."
5. Pray for our church to submit to God's will in everything we believe and do.
