Discussion Questions

The following questions help us dialog with the sermon, music, and liturgy in this morning's worship service. Together, these elements provide space for reflection and prayer during personal devotions, group studies, and family worship.

How was the word "Delivered" defined in the sermon?
What image or illustration sticks in your mind as it relates to being delivered?
How have we as Christians been delivered, and how are we being delivered?
When we pray, "Deliver us from evil," what and/or who are we praying to be delivered from?
How have you experienced the Father answering this prayer?
What are you facing now that reveals your need to pray this prayer?

Prayer Prompts:

Use the following prompts to guide you in prayer this week: Matthew 6.9-13 "Deliver us from evil"

- 1. Praise God for His infinite and almighty power over all things.
- 2. Ask God to guard you in the particular temptations, deceptions, and dangers you are facing today using the words of 2 Thessalonians 3.3, "The Lord is faithful. He will establish you and guard you against the evil one."
- 3. Pray for God to protect our church from Satan's evil schemes to distract us, to divide us, and discourage us.
- 4. Give God praise for the promise of Psalm 91.9-10, "Because you have made the LORD your dwelling place, the Most High who is my refuge, no evil shall be allowed to befall you."
