The following questions help us engage with the sermon, music, and liturgy in this morning's worship service, and may be useful during personal devotions, group studies, and family worship.

2.	Why is the Bible called a "two-edged sword""? What does the image of a sword tell us about the Word of God?
3.	How is the Bible our authority? Why is the Bible's authority much deeper than a book of rules?
4.	In what was the problem with the church in Pergamum the opposite of the problem with the church in Ephesus?
5.	What does the Word of God have to do with judgment?
6.	What does the Word of God have to do with salvation?
7.	Read Revelation 2.17 and Isaiah 62.2. Why does the promise of a new name give us hope?
